

ROAD TO CHARTER

The University was given a Provisional License to operate on 28th September 2015 under registration no.UI.PL.028

On 26th Jan. 2016, the University was officially opened and on 5th Feb 2016, pioneer students were admitted.

In 2019 NCHE requested Institutions to submit their roadmap towards charter Acquisition.

In May 2022, we submitted our first Charter application

In January 2023, NCHE Team visited the University to assess progress and further guide on the necessary requirements for charter acquisition.

In May, 2023 we conducted a self-assessment which was key in identifying areas of improvement.

VUST submitted a revised application to NCHE on 30th June, 2023.

On 14th January, 2024 a team from our university went to NCHE for vetting.

In July 2024, VUST received an Inspection Team from NCHE

At its 78th council sitting on January 31, 2025, in accordance with Section 105(3) of the Universities and Other Tertiary Institutions Act CAP 262, NCHE cleared VUST for grant of Charter.

On 3rd July, 2025, His Excellency the President of Uganda, H.E Yoweri Kaguta Museveni signed our Charter

THE UNIVERSITIES AND OTHER TERTIARY

INSTITUTIONS ACT CAP. 262

VALLEY UNIVERSITY OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY (VUST)

CHARTER, 2025

WHEREAS the promoters established in Uganda an Institution in the name of Valley University of Science and Technology (VUST) which we now wish to be chartered;

AND WHEREAS the said Valley University of Science and Technology (VUST) has applied to the National Council for Higher Education for the grant of a Charter in the manner prescribed under the Universities and Other Tertiary Institutions Act Cap. 262;

AND WHEREAS the National Council for Higher Education has visited and inspected the said Institution and is satisfied that the objects of Valley



University of Science and Technology (VUST) are consistent with the advancement of University Education in the Republic of Uganda;

AND WHEREAS the National Council for Higher Education is also satisfied that Valley University of Science and Technology (VUST) has complied with the provisions of the Act;

a Charter for the said institution to the Minister of Education and Sports, a copy whereof is annexed hereto and the Minister is satisfied that Valley University of Science and Technology (VUST) be granted the Charter;

AND WHEREAS the Minister has submitted the Charter to me with recommendations thereon;

AND WHEREAS I COMMAND that the attached Charter may be amended by the appropriate organs of Valley University of Science and Technology (VUST) with the approval of the National Council for Higher Education and myself;



THE REPUBLIC OF UGANDA

AND WHEREAS I am satisfied that granting of the Charter will be of benefit to the advancement of University Education in the Republic of Uganda;

NOW THEREFORE, by these presents, be it known that in the exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the Constitution and by Section 106(2) of the Universities and Other Tertiary Institutions Act Cap. 262;

I, Yoweri Kaguta Museveni, President of the Republic of Uganda, HEREBY grant the Charter annexed hereto, to VALLEY UNIVERSITY OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY (VUST).
